Identify Your Treasure

Today we will be looking at a passage from Matthew 6 where Jesus addresses treasure. Interestingly, Jesus addresses these issues in the context of hypocrisy. We don't typically view this passage in terms of hypocrisy, but I find this interesting.



I would challenge you to consider this passage in light of hypocrisy. Think of all the different ways that people identify Christians as hypocrites. Normally the term applies through the way Christians intentionally treat other people. For

instance, if a very outspoken Christian were to engage in adultery, murder, or gossip this would be legitimate grounds for the label of hypocrisy to be applied.

In America, Christians are less likely to be labeled hypocritical with regards to their money. The primary reason is that in America money is almost universally understood to be controlled by the individual. Thus, every person is free to do what he or she desires with their money within the confines of the law. This, however, is not the way followers of Christ should view money. Even our money should be under the control and submission of Jesus.

America is without question the wealthiest country on the planet. As a result, American Christians are considered by the rest of the world to be the most materially blessed people on the planet. Therefore, how we spend our money impacts how other Christians around the world view us. Is it possible that Christians in Africa or Asia see our affluence and wonder why we are not more generous with the material possessions God has given us? Do they view American Christians as hypocrites in the context of how we spend our money?

Let's be generous with the resources with which God has blessed us.
